Your Welcome Message is a description of your cause, information about your organization, and a personal note to your fundraisers and contributors.

As with all of the text boxes in Active Giving, they use "HTML" (a coding language) to reflect paragraphs, line breaks, links to different websites, etc...





Adding an Image with HTML

- 1) Got to a photo upload site (photo bucket, Active Giving etc.)
- 2) Upload you photo
- 3) Right click on the photo and click on "Properties" (see below)



4) Copy the location link



- 5) Plug the location link into the following HTML code

- 6) Plug the HTML code into the welcome message to insert your image.
- 7) To make this an image link (click on it to go to another web page), add in the following code:
